Ada P. (Whittle) Wilson, 68, of New Castle, went home to be with the Lord on Thursday, August 14, 2014 at Stonebrooke Rehabilitation Centre.

She was born December 30, 1945 near Russell Springs, Kentucky in the community of Eli, a daughter of the late Rys and Mary Eva (Wilson) Whittle.

Ada worked at the North End Market in New Castle for many years as well as Marsh and Meijer Supermarkets. She was saved on April 27, 1958 at age 12 and soon thereafter felt a call to the ministry.
