Beulah Craw Bookout Gallnitz, also known as Bea, was admired and loved by all who knew her. An avid student of poetry, painting and numerous crafts, Bea passed away on Sunday, November 18, 2007 in Jacksonville Beach, Florida, one day shy of age 90.

She was born November 19, 1917 in Gaston Indiana, a daughter of the late Clayton Craw and Eva Payne Craw.

Bea graduated with honors from Gaston High School and married Ward S. Bookout who passed away in 1971. As a resident of Henry County she was active in the community and the Blountsville Christian Church.
