November 20, 1932 - May 1, 2020

Clara Lucille (Trimble) Hamm, 87, of Burlington, Kentucky, went home to be with the Lord on the morning of Friday, May 1, 2020 at Woodcrest Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Elsmere, Kentucky.

She was born November 20, 1932 in Faubush, Kentucky, in Pulaski County, a daughter of the late, Huey and Mollie (Rogers) Trimble.

Lucille served for 25 years as an Executive Secretary with the Internal Revenue Service where she received multiple achievement awards prior to her retirement. She was a long-time member of the Burlington Bible Church where she taught Sunday School, served as Secretary and Treasurer for the church and missions department. She and her sister, Faye, started the nursing home visitation program for the church. Lucille enjoyed working puzzles, baking, reading missionary romance novels and especially her Bible. She had a unique sense of humor, a “knack with finances”, and most of all had compassion for the less fortunate and gave to them as much as possible.
