Donald I. Kissick, age 76 of Mt. Summit went home to be with the Lord high noon Friday, January 19, 2007 in Muncie Health and Rehabilitation Center. He was born in Henry County to Espie and Ollie (Baty) Kissick on April 12, 1930.

He was a 1948 graduate of Mt. Summit High School. Mr. Kissick was a long time Henry County farmer and employed as a school bus driver for Blue River Valley School Corporation 33 years, from 1969 – 2002. He was also a longtime member and seven year custodian of the First Baptist Church in Muncie.

He served in the U.S. Army from 1954 – 1956.

Mr. Kissick was an active member of the Springport Christian Church where he served as former Board Chairman, Trustee and Deacon.
