Edith Bell Green, 93, of New Castle died Sunday, October 23, 2011 at Glen Oaks Health Campus.

She was born April 21, 1918 in Owingsville, Kentucky, a daughter of the late John Clay and Okie Ona (Atchison) Reeves.

In 1928 Edith and her family moved to New Castle. She graduated from Sulphur Springs High School in 1938. She worked at J.J.
