Kathryn Kay (Davis) Anderson, 65, of Winchester, went home to be with the Lord Friday, December 21, 2007 at her residence following a courageous battle against cancer.

She was born June 12, 1942 in Cherry Fork, Ohio a daughter of Leonard and Virginia (Scott) Davis.

Kay graduated as valedictorian from Martinsville High School in 1960. She was an excellent homemaker and loving mother, raising nine sons. She enjoyed sewing and cooking. She was a giving person and a community oriented volunteer with the Winchester Pregnancy Care Center as a counselor and the annual Walk For Life. Kay was known for helping senior citizens, anyone in need and those who had no one else to turn to. She delivered groceries, medical supplies and inspiration. She faithfully worshipped with the Randolph Friends Church for 16 years teaching Sunday School Classes and training other teachers.

Directions to Randolph Friends Church: 6499 N. CR 300 W. Ridgeville, IN. From Muncie: 32 to Farmland. When 32 turns to the right stay straight and continue east on E. Jackson St. which becomes 200 N. and go 5 miles to 300 W. Turn left or North and travel about 6 miles to church.

From Winchester: 32 to 300 W turn N or Right and go approx. 6 ½ miles to the church.

From North of Winchester: 27 South to 28 W to 200 W and turn left or south and go 1 mile to 700 N turn right and go 1 mile to 300 W and turn L. and less than 1 mile to church.

From South of Winchester: 27 North to 650 N turn left or west and go two miles to T at 200 W and turn N or R and go ½ mile to 700 N and turn W or Left and go 1 mile to 300 W and turn S or Left and church is less than 1 mile.

Directions to Buena Vista Cemetery: 500 W and 300 S in Farmland from Randolph Friends.

South on 300 W (cross over 32) approx 9 miles to 300 S turn West or Right and go two miles to cemetery.
