Lillian Mary Meta (Luelf) Hampton entered into the presence of her Lord on November 17, 2007 in Phoenix, Arizona.

She was born April 6, 1913 in Truxton, Missouri, a daughter of the late Herman August Luelf and Alma Florentina (Winter) Luelf.

Lillian was a homemaker and faithful member of the Troy Bible Holiness Church for over 60 years. She loved to read her Bible and was a faithful prayer warrior. She had a heart for missions and often sacrificed personally to send funds to missions. She also provided elder care to several in her community and it is notable that more than 30 adults claim they were raised by "Grandma Hampton." Recorded in her own testimony is her conversion and desire to do God's will. Included in that desire was for God to show her who her husband was to be. He did and Thomas Oscar Hampton and Lillian were married February 4, 1935. They are now reunited in Heaven.
