



Dr. Lynn A. Bowers

February 18, 1960 - February 18, 2010

Son...brother...husband...doctor...father...friend...patient. Dr. Lynn A. Bowers will forever be these things for all of us. After passing away from cancer on Thursday, February 18, 2010, we reflect on all the ways he came into our lives and forever left his mark. No matter how you knew him—Dr. B., Skinny, Mr. B, Daddy, Doc, Lynn Allen, Ed, Bro, QBall, Lynnage, Uncle M or Dad—he had a way of connecting with you that was somehow unforgettable and uniquely sincere. He had this ability to draw people in and make them believe, laugh, cry, or make a change...and he did it all with an amazing sense of humor and passion to live.

Dr. Bowers was unselfishly dedicated to his family, to his pediatric practice, to St. Anne Catholic Church, and to his community of New Castle, Indiana.

Through that dedication he was able to better many lives around him and did so by involving himself in just about anything for which he felt strongly. His journey began 64 years ago when he was born to Lucile and Vernon Bowers. He graduated from New Castle Chrysler High School, from Ball State University, and from Indiana University School of Medicine. He served his medical internship and residency at Riley Children's Hospital in Indianapolis then headed off to Texas to serve as a Major in the U.S. Army in the department of Pediatrics at Darnall Army Hospital, where he also served as Chief of Pediatrics. He came back to launch successfully New Castle Pediatrics as the only pediatric practice in Henry County. Over the years he served as an officer in the Henry County Health Department, the Director of

Henry County March of Dimes, a Pediatric Consultant for the New Castle State Developmental Center, the Co-Director of the Indiana Soldiers' and Sailors' Children's Home, a member and President of the New Castle School Board, Chairman of the Board for Suburban Health Organization, and President/ CEO of Suburban Physician Organization in Indianapolis.

In addition to his leadership roles, he also dedicated himself to programs and organizations in which he felt he could make a difference...serving and supporting his community were very important to him. He served as County Medical Officer on the Henry County Board of Health, was a board member of the Henry County Memorial Hospital Foundation, served as a past President of the Henry County Memorial Hospital medical staff, established a neo-natal critical care unit at HCMH, was a past President of the Henry County Medical Society, was a member and lay leader at St. Anne Catholic Church, and established teaching/training opportunities at New Castle Pediatrics with several professional schools including his alma mater IU School of Medicine and School of Nursing. He also served as a consultant for the New Castle State Developmental Center, the Henry County MCH/WIC programs, Henry County Head-Start, the Bennett House Children's Shelter, the Henrico and Agape Day Care, the Knightstown Soldier's and Sailor's Home, and the Children's Health Care Services and SSI. He also served as a committee member of the Henry County Division of Family and Children. He was very proud of his establishment of his pediatric practice as a Rural Health Clinic because he believed that no child in need of care should ever go without service because of a lack of resources. For many of his contributions and for his commitment to others, he was recently awarded one of Indiana's highest honors known as the Sagamore of the Wabash award; and for his contribution in the field of Preventive Medicine and Public Health by improving access to immunization services to underinsured Hoosier children, he received Indiana's Premier Health Award known as the Tony and Mary Hulman Health Achievement Award. What's funny about all of the things we read here, he never once sought recognition for all the service and hard work he so easily

and effortlessly offered.

Aside from his personal and professional accomplishments, Dr. Bowers had many loves in his life. He was an avid runner, having run five marathons, the last one at age 50 in Chicago. He had a green thumb and spent the growing seasons nurturing his “little darlins” in his garden. He spent many winters making road trips and lasting memories on his way to Colorado and Utah for ski trips with the “Bros”, his family, and any other family member who thought they could keep up. You could often find him listening to music, reading a good non-fiction book he had discovered while listening to NPR, or delving into the great articles in the Wall Street Journal about which he so often talked. His fascination with photography produced many great shots of friends and family and fed his desire to catch memory-making in the moment. And if you were lucky to visit when he was playing his piano, it was always a treat. One of the greatest things about “Dad” was that anyone who has ever spent time with him has a “story” about him. There are stories about Kick the Can, board games, Westwood, road trips, barn parties, Texas, holidays, high school buddies, Bridge and Euchre, Thunder Foot, Italy, Winnie the Pooh stories, skiing...and many, many more. He really didn't have one “story of a life” as the song goes. His life was made up of all kinds of stories that came together and created this amazing person we call friend. And everyone who knew Lynn A. Bowers needed him to be exactly who he was. And he always delivered. Dr. Bowers is survived by his devoted wife Cassandra Bowers and his three children, Vanessa Ellefsen (Tom) from Indianapolis, Bret Bowers (Gia) from Texas, and Jacquelynn Frauman (Justin) from Texas. He is also survived by five brothers and a sister, Stuart Bowers (Joan) from Texas, Michael Bowers (Barbara) from Virginia, Tom Bowers (Sheila) from Florida, Douglas Bowers (Laurie) from North Carolina, Timothy Bowers (Julie) from Indiana, and Marybeth Harris (Larry) from Colorado. Also surviving are seven grandchildren, Caitlynn Marie, Sabrina Carroll, Evan Joseph, Ryann Lynn, Jackson Cain, Ellie Rose, and Deacon Wesley...and many nieces and

nephews who practically considered "Uncle M" to be a second father. He was preceded in death by his parents, Vernon and Lucile Bowers, and by a brother, David Bowers.

Visitation will be held in New Castle, Indiana, at Sproles Family Funeral Home on Monday, February 22, 2010 from 2-8 p.m. Funeral Mass will be held at St. Anne Catholic Church in New Castle, Indiana on Tuesday, February 23, 2010 at 10:00 a.m. with Father Joe Rautenberg officiating. Burial will follow in St. Anne Cemetery.
