Marion Woolsey, 93, of New Castle, died on Thursday, January 20, 2022, at Henry Community Health following a brief illness.

He was born on June 30, 1928, in Bicknell, Indiana, a son of the late Mariah Isabell (Thompson) and William Woolsey.

Marion was a toolmaker and retired from Chrysler Corporation following 41 years of employment. While in high school in Linton, Marion was an outstanding basketball and football player.
