December 14, 1913 - February 15, 2008

Mildred Todd Davis, 94, of New Castle passed away Friday, February 15, 2008 at Glen Oaks Health Campus after a short illness.

She was born December 14, 1913 in Yadkinville, North Carolina, a daughter of William Henry Todd and Nettie Williams Todd.

For five years she was a partner with the late Mida Lander in the Peter Pan Nursery School. After the retirement of Mrs. Lander she continued for another 17 years with her own private school. She was a long-time member of the Sugar Grove United Methodist Church, the Shakespeare Club, the Altruistic Literary Club, and attended the Trinity United Methodist Church. She was the curator of the Henry County Historical Museum for a number of years.

She loved the New Castle Trojans and the graduating class of 1932 of which she was a member. She volunteered for the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame for 16 years. She loved God, her country, her daughter, and her extended family and showed an uncommon abundance of understanding and compassion. She possessed the ability to make everyone feel special, but was totally unaware of how special she was herself.

She is survived by her daughter, Carol Ann Davis Wilson of New Castle; her grandson, Jeffrey T. (wife: Diane) Wilson of Oaklandon; and her great-grandson, Steven; two sisters, Betty T. Cashner of New Castle and Vianna Snider of Lafayette; a sister-in-law, Eula Todd of New Castle and several nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Ora J. Davis; a

brother, George E. Todd and a sister, Arbutice Todd Joyner.

A funeral service in celebration of Mildred's life will be 11:00 a.m. Tuesday, February 19, 2008 at Sproles Family Funeral Home with Pastor Howard Addison and Rev. Marion Hickman officiating.

Burial will follow in South Mound Cemetery.
