December 25, 1911 - May 18, 2009

Ora May Marlow, 97, of New Castle, died 4:55 a.m., Monday, May 18, 2009 in Wabash County Hospital Skilled Unit following an illness of a week.

Ora May was born December 25, 1911 in Casey County, Kentucky to the late Thomas and Oda Ellen (McFarland) Luttrell.

Ora May was a member of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in New Castle where she had served several years as a Sunday school teacher. She was a homemaker most of her life but worked at Firestone during World War II. She married Goodson G. Marlow on September 1, 1929 in the Pilgrim Holiness Church in New Castle.
