



## Orville "Kenny" K. Brummett

November 10, 1928 - April 19, 2010

Orville K. "Kenny" Brummett, 81, of New Castle, died Monday at Henry County Hospital following a lengthy illness.

He was born November 10, 1928 in New Castle, a son of the late Jonas and Nora (Rowe) Brummett.

Kenny served in the U.S. Army during World War II and the Korean War where he dropped supplies to Marines from cargo planes. He was a part of the team that dropped a bridge to stranded Marines at the Battle of the Chosin Reservoir enabling them to escape. He loved people and was an excellent salesman. He began his career at the Gaar Studebaker Dealership and spent several years at Morris Chevrolet. In his younger years, he enjoyed racing cars at Mt. Lawn Speedway. He retired from Logston's Auto Supply where he sold auto parts throughout Indiana, Illinois and Ohio. During retirement he enjoyed selling at flea markets and fishing. He and his wife, Vivian, whom he married on August 22, 1952, had attended the Wesleyan Methodist Church and also the United Brethren Church.

He is survived by his wife of 57 years, Vivian (Williams) Brummett; a daughter, Kennetha Guffey of New Castle; two sons, Jeffrey K. (wife: Vanessa) Brummett of New Castle and Charles E.
