November 13, 1931 - October 19, 2018

Ray Herbert Howell, 86, of New Castle, took his final trail ride dismounting in Heaven early on the morning of Friday, October 19, 2018 at Glen Oaks Health Campus in New Castle.

He was born at home on November 13, 1931 in Lewis County, Kentucky, a son of the late Edward and Rebecca Agnes (Evans) Howell.

Ray was raised on a farm in Northeast Ky, in the Mountains. He served in the US Army and was stationed in Germany during the Korean War. On February 18, 1956, Ray married the love of his life and close companion, Carol Jane Hord. Ray came to New Castle in 1959 and worked for Henry County Hospital as an aide and an orderly. He then went to work for Standard Oil and drove a tanker for 7 years driving a home delivery route. He retired from Westwood Elementary School after 26 years as a custodian.

Ray had a passion for horses and loved to say with a smile “it was a disease I contracted as a child.” He trained horses on the side and full time after retirement. He especially enjoyed driving horses with carriages. Ray and Carol enjoyed trail riding all over the country with their friends and fellow horsemen.

Ray was a kind and gentle soul, easy to talk with and easy to be around. He was a faithful and dedicated follower of Christ and attended Greensboro Church of the Nazarene since 1972.

Those left to cherish Ray’s memory include his wife of 62 years, Carol Howell; a sister, Geraldine (husband: James) Porter of Flemingsburg, KY; several nieces and nephews, including Arnold Howell of Lewis County, KY, and many, many friends.

Ray was preceded in death by a brother and seven sisters, May Howell, Gladys Bradley, Flora Jones, Walter Howell, Gertrude Howell, Nola Fields, Dora Howell, and Jewel Stidam.
