Ronald E. Hale, 73, of New Castle, passed away Monday, December 8, 2014 at Community Hospital in Anderson.

He was born August 30, 1941 in New Castle, a son of the late Raymond and Izel Hale.

Ronald graduated from Walter P. Chrysler High School, a member of the Class of 1959. He retired from Dana Corporation after 29 years, after the closing of the New Castle plant. Following his retirement, he then worked for the New Castle Street Department for 10 years. Ronald was a competitive wrestler and power lifter and held several national titles in power lifting. He was a member and President of the Central Indiana Weight Lifting Club. Ronald was an animal and nature lover. He enjoyed riding his motorcycle and he particularly loved the time he spent with his family, especially his grandchildren.
