



Theodore Lawrence Salkoski

November 17, 1955 - January 2, 2017

Theodore Lawrence “Ted” Salkoski, 61, of New Castle, passed away on the evening of Monday, January 2, 2017 at Henry County Hospital after a short illness.

He was born November 17, 1955 in Baltimore, Maryland, a son of Theodore “Ted” and Dolores “Sue” (Carey) Salkoski.

Ted was a 1973 graduate of Lincoln High School in Cambridge City. He attended Indiana University East where he studied journalism. He was self-employed as an independent producer of business magazines. Ted loved Florida and lived there for many years. He was an avid Baltimore Orioles and Ravens fan and enjoyed gardening.
