Windel Marlow, 95, of New Castle, went home to be with the Lord Friday evening at Heritage House Rehabilitation and Care Center in New Castle following a brief illness.

He was born November 12, 1913 in Clinton County, Kentucky, a son of the late Frank and Viva Anna (Catron) Marlow.

Windel had been employed at the Hoosier Cabinet Company, WPA and Wayne Body Works in Richmond. He worked for Chrysler Corporation in New Castle for 30 years retiring December 31, 1972. He served in the Army National Guard for five years in the late 1930's. When he was a young man, during the great depression, he would ride freight trains across different parts of the country; Los Angeles, New York City, and Miami and held many different jobs for short periods of time along the way. He played the guitar and enjoyed woodworking and fishing. He was also an avid bingo player.

He is survived by four children, Eldred (wife: Delores) Marlow, Joyce Giddings, Melvin Marlow, and Sharon (husband: Gene) Hancock all of New Castle; numerous grandchildren, great and great-great-grandchildren; and several nieces, nephews and cousins.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Mildred (Tremain) Marlow, whom he married on May 17, 1936; a brother, Goodson Marlow; an infant brother, William Marlow; and four sisters, Mae Scott, Gladys Hill, Dorothy Davis and Marie Smith.
